A message from Charles Stradford, President

As the gavel is passed to the new Board President, I would like to take this opportunity to thank each of our donors, fundraisers and volunteers for their years of support of Greater Marlboro Programs, Inc., (GMPI). It is through your active participation that we have been able to provide quality services for the individuals that we serve at GMPI and other agencies. I would also like to thank all of our full and part time employees, without their dedication we would not be the stable and viable agency that we are today.

This year GMPI celebrates its thirty third year of existence. The original concept was intended to give a handful of parents with mentally handicapped and/or developmentally disabled children under their care at home, an opportunity for periodic respite. Shortly thereafter, a change in state law/policy regarding state institutions led to the creation of GMPI which was established to serve families in Marlborough, Northborough, Southborough, Westborough, and Hudson. For more than twenty years the agency has supported three residential sites in Marlborough. Two of these sites house a maximum of eight individuals each and the third is home to twelve individuals. Over the years we have added clients who live in independent situations and we continue to support a large number of families who still have mentally disabled family members at home. In addition to the residential sites, the agency also provides transportation for many of our clients to and from their work, appointments, and around their communities. Both the residential and work transportation programs are funded by the state. Additionally, GMPI also boasts a very unique social agenda for its clients and individuals of other agencies. This social program is totally funded by the contributions made by our donor base. The program is unique in that it not only has a well thought out calendar of events but it also promotes safety by providing chaperones and door to door transportation for each participant to and from the activities.

The number of individuals that will require the kinds of support provided by a GMPI will not diminish. There are many individuals who are being supported through the school systems today. Once they become twenty-one years of age, they will then require the support services of GMPI. In order to meet their needs, the agency has to begin an expansion program immediately if we want to continue with the same quality and the numbers of services that we provide today. Our Executive Director is currently developing plans for that expansion. We will be looking to you, our support base, to assist in the growth of the organization. Based on our past experience, I am confident that you will provide the support that we need to help GMPI grow and remain strong.

Once again, I sincerely appreciate all of the help you have given the agency. Your support has allowed GMPI's clients to grow and become productive and responsible citizens within their communities.

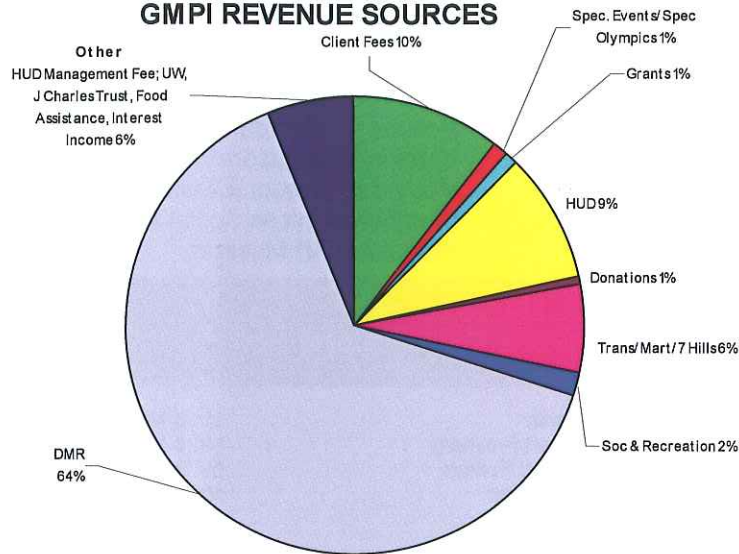

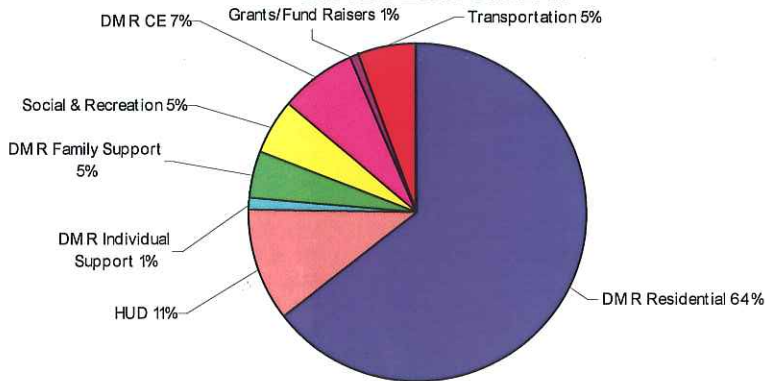
